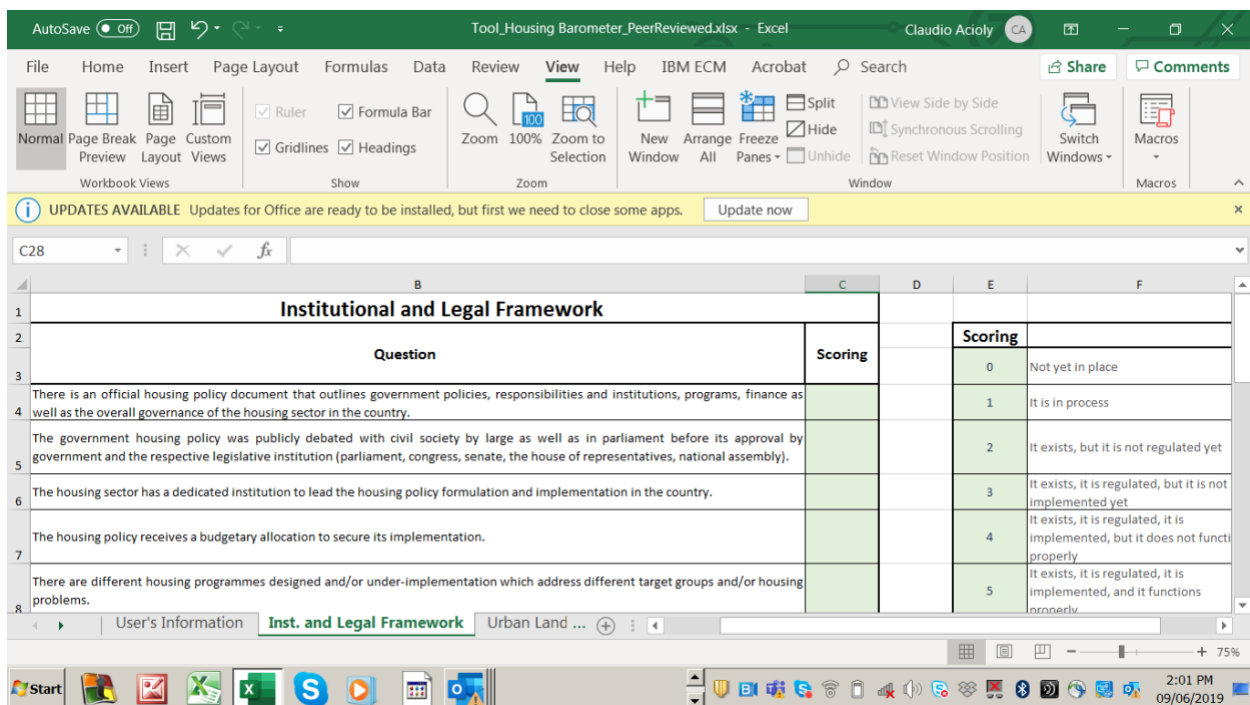




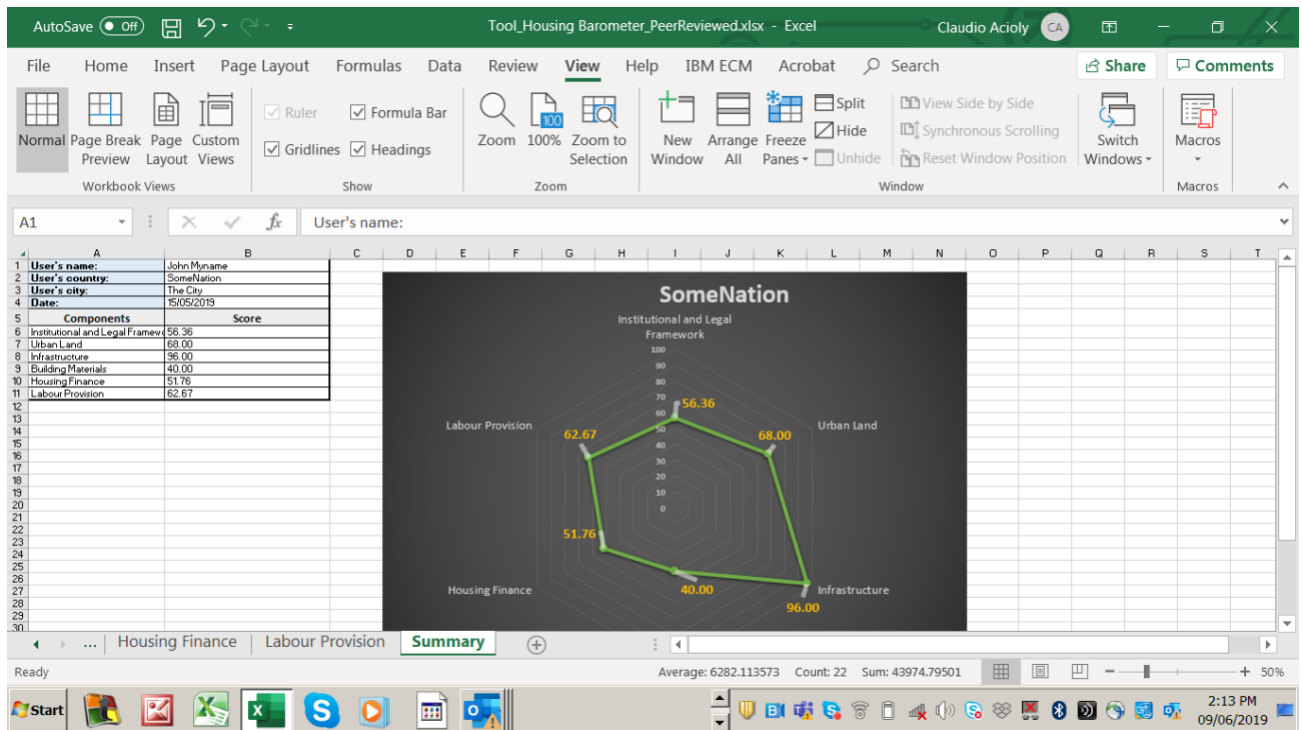
At the bottom of the Excel screen, the user will find several workbooks related to:

1. Participant information
2. Institutional and Legal Framework
3. Urban Land
4. Infrastructure
5. Building Materials
6. Housing Finance

Open each workbook and proceed with answering all the questions and recording the scoring to each question on the column 'C' (from zero do 5) according to the instructions found on the right side of the screen. The instruction on the right side provides the explanation for each scoring from 0 to 5.



The last workbook shows the outcome of the answers given on each of the previous workbooks and summarized in a housing barometer diagram, a diamond, expressing the totals given for each of sub-dimensions of housing. This is found in the last workbook, as follows:



The resulted diagram (above) provides the user with a rapid overview of the problem areas of the housing sector where one can possibly identify shortcomings in public policy. This indicates areas where there is possibly need for further data collection and more in-depth analysis. It provides a visual aid to support policy dialogue and aid the discussions about the deep-rooted causes of such shortcomings and the possible policy interventions needed.
